Mary writes.....

Dear friends,



Throughout the year, and regardless of the season, Morning Prayer includes this prayer:

The night has passed and the day lies open before us,

let us pray with one heart and mind....

As we rejoice in this new day, so may the light of your presence,

O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you.

There is a saying 'familiarity breeds contempt', and sometimes the very familiarity of words in our prayers can cause, if not contempt, then a degree of disregard; we take the words for granted and fail to take them to heart.

I've been reflecting on this prayer for a while now, and found that the little word 'As' allows this prayer to be interpreted in more than one way.

What does 'As' mean? The dictionary gives a variety of ways to use this little word, I've picked four; 'Because' - 'When' - 'Whilst' and - 'In the same way, or to the same degree.'

Substituting any of these meanings into the prayer changes it slightly; so we might say **because** we rejoice, or, **when** we rejoice, or **whilst** we rejoice, or **to the same degree that** we rejoice; *the light of God's presence sets our hearts on fire....*; all of which mean something slightly different.

However, they all highlight the truth that prayer is a two way process – it involves both us and God; when we come close to God, God comes close to us.

Through my reflections, I've come up with this thought:- 'It is in rejoicing that the light of God's presence sets our hearts on fire with love'.

Making a point of rejoicing in the gift and potential of each new day, opens our hearts and minds to know the reality of God's presence with us, causing our hearts to burn with love for Him, and for that love to overflow into all our other relationships. '**Rejoicing'** also has different meanings, but each new day brings so many things into our lives that we can 'be glad about' or 'take delight in' or 'be blessed by' or 'celebrate'; just this morning I rejoiced in the early morning sunshine, in listening to the hens laying, the birds singing, and in spotting the tiny buds that hold the promise of apricots, plums and cherries on our trees in the summer.

As we continue our journey through this Easter season, we also rejoice in knowing that we are Easter People; Jesus **is** risen from the dead, he **did** conquer death, he **has** raised us to new and eternal life with him.


So, we look forward to Ascension Day, (9th May) and to Pentecost (19th May) when we rejoice in Jesus' return to the Father's side in heaven, and celebrate his breathing of the Holy Spirit on us.

The ten days between Ascension and Pentecost are set aside for a world-wide wave of prayer known as '*Thy kingdom Come*'. During those ten days we are encouraged to pray for five people who do not yet know Jesus, that their hearts and minds might be opened to God's love, forgiveness and peace.

I believe our prayer for them will be more effective if our own hearts are burning with love for God, so I encourage you all to '*rejoice in each new day*' and to allow '*the light of God*'s presence to set your hearts on fire with love' for Him and for his world.

The other day I was going through some old parish papers and I came across an appeal for funds dated October 1954 for – guess what – a new central heating boiler for St. Pauls Hall! The paper was urging people to donate "A Bob for the Boiler"; for those lucky readers of Parish News who are of an age not to remember "old money", a "Bob" was slang for a shilling, which is the equivalent of 5 pence. At that time, the estimated cost of a new boiler was £200, compared to £20,000 today. So, if we were to run a campaign today on similar lines, we would be asking not for 5p but 500p. 100 times more expensive. All fivers gratefully received! John B.


Thy Kingdom Come
